Sunday April 5 at 1:30PM. Start at Sidney & Bridge St Belleville. This will be a hunt by car. The fox will be determined at the March hunt.

Saturday May 2 at 12 PM until 3PM or until all foxes are found by everyone. This will be the spring **Tour of the County** hunt. There will be 3 transmitters located somewhere in Prince Edward County. The hunt will start at Pinecrest Elementary School Bloomfield.

Wednesday June 10 at 7 PM. The start place is yet to be determined.

Thursday July 2 at 6PM. This will be a turkey shoot format. Hunters will hunt as a team. This is to simulate a group of armatures hunting for an interfering transmitter. The fox will be somewhere in Prince Edward County. The hunters will start at various points around the county.

Sunday November 8 at 1:30 PM. Start at Sidney & Bridge St Belleville. This will be a hunt by car. The fox will be determined at the October hunt.

Foxhunt Rules

Everyone is welcome. If you have never hunted before come to the start location and ride along with one of the more experienced hunters. There is some spare equipment available so ask one of the regular hunters if you may borrow some equipment to try foxhunting.

First transmission will be as noted in the schedule above, and the hunt should be over within 90 minutes or less. (Except for the Tour of the County Foxhunts).

The fox can be anywhere with the following guidelines. Must be heard from the start point. Must be in a public location; i.e. no private property. Must be in a safe location; e.g. not in a high traffic area.

** Shortest driving distance wins.**

After the hunt we can meet at a location to be determined to do a post hunt analysis, pick a fox for the next month, and discuss other important events of the day.

Bay Bridge Net Update - Controllers Wanted

The Tuesday Bay Bridge Net on VE3TJU (146.73 Mhz) at 7:30 PM has been operating for several years in it's current format with a core group of Net Controllers taking the load of acting as the Net Control Station. Some of the controllers have expressed a desire of stepping out of the rotation and taking a lesser role of acting as NCS less frequently.

The Bay Bridge Net is a very informal net and would be a good training ground for anyone wanting to 'get their feet wet' in a net control situation. We are therefore at this time asking for volunteers to act as net controllers either in a fixed rotation, or as a 'fill-in' controller as the need arises. Radio Amateurs of Canada (RAC) has a new President

At the February 24th, 2009 Radio Amateurs of Canada Board teleconference meeting, President **Dave Goodwin, VE3AAQ/VO1AU**, announced that he was resigning his position effective immediately. Dave indicated that his decision was motivated by his inability to devote enough time to RAC affairs because of a recent increase in personal and professional responsibilities.

Dave became RAC President on Jan 1st, 2008 at the end of President Earle Smith's tenure. All attending the teleconference thanked Dave for the time he could devote to RAC's affairs both as a Director and then as President.

At the same teleconference meeting, the RAC Board elected **Bob Cooke, VE3BDB**, to be the RAC President until the end of the current term on Dec 31, 2009. Bob has a long history of working with RAC. His involvement started in the early 1990s as an Assistant Director and he was elected and served as RAC Ontario South Director from November 2001 to January 2005. He was then elected by the RAC Board as Vice president for Field Services, serving from January 2006 to February 2009 when he resigned to accept the appointment as President.

Dear Ma and Pa,

I am well. Hope you are. Tell Brother Walt and Brother Elmer the Marine Corps beats working for old man Minch by a mile. Tell them to join up quick before all of the places are filled. I was restless at first because you get to stay in bed till nearly 6 a.m. But I am getting so I like to sleep late. Tell Walt and Elmer all you do before breakfast is smooth your cot, and shine some things. No hogs to slop, feed to pitch, mash to mix, wood to split, fire to lay. Practically nothing.

Men got to shave but it is not so bad, there's warm water. We go on 'route marches,' which the platoon sergeant says are long walks to harden us. If he thinks so, it's not my place to tell him different. A 'route march' is about as far as to our mailbox at home. Then the city guys get sore feet and we all ride back in trucks.

The sergeant is like a schoolteacher. He nags a lot. The Captain is like the school board. Majors and colonels just ride around and frown. They don't bother you none.

This next will kill Walt and Elmer with laughing. I keep getting medals for shooting. I don't know why. The bulls-eye is near as big as a chipmunk head and don't move, and it ain't shooting at you like the Higgett boys at home. All you got to do is lie there all comfortable and hit it. You don't even load your own cartridges they come in boxes.

Then we have what they call hand-to-hand combat training. You get to wrestle with them city boys. I have to be real careful though, they break real easy. It ain't like fighting with that ole bull at home. I'm about the best they got in this except for that Tug Jordan from over in Silver Lake. I only beat him once.. He joined up the same time as me, but I'm only 5'6' and 130 pounds and he's 6'8' and near 300 pounds dry.

Be sure to tell Walt and Elmer to hurry and join before other fellers get onto this setup and come stampeding in.
